Admissions information

Purdue Global Law School has three first year classes each year. Purdue Global Law School does not require applicants to its JD program to sit for the LSAT, but Purdue Global Law School has its own 40-question online admissions test with a minimum score requirement. During the 2022-23 reporting year, approximately 58% of applicants who undertake the online test are disqualified from applying to the JD program for not meeting required admissions test scores.

Employment Outcomes

The employment data reported below was compiled from a survey of graduates of Purdue Global Law School's Juris Doctor program. Because Purdue Global Law School is required to report survey results for employment for each of the first three years after graduation, Purdue Global Law School is reporting survey results for its 2021 graduates.

Twenty four surveys were sent out and twelve graduates responded, for an overall response rate of 50%. 100% of the respondents reported being currently employed. Of those that responded, 42% reported being employed in a position where a JD is required for their position and 58% reported that a JD was an advantage in their current position.
